 - 2. Present to the Board a written report at least quarterly in order to advise the board on the activities of the Committee.
 - 3. Present to the Board an annual written report which shall include a statement indicating if the District is in compliance with the requirements and a summary of the Committee's proceedings and activities for the preceding year.

Committee members may not be employees of the college or have any financial relationship with the college such as a vendor, contractor, or consultant.
