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# **IV. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT**

<u>Management Association Update/Classified Staff Recognition Award</u>: SMC Management Association President AI DeSalles presented the Classified Staff Recognition Award for January to Lucita Remonde, who has worked in the SMC Auxiliary Services for over 12 years.

<u>Vocational Education</u>: Two managers have been promoted to fill the vacancy left by John Gonzalez, Dean of Instructional Services and Occupational Education, who has taken a position at Monterey Peninsula College. Erica LeBlanc was promoted to Dean of Academic Affairs and Continuing Education. Felicito Cajayon is now the acting Dean of Workforce Development.

<u>CCLC Legislative Conference in Sacramento, January 28-29, 2007</u>: Arrangements will be made for several trustees who are attending this conference to visit with key legislators to discuss a variety of important community college issues.

<u>Faculty Hires for Fall 2007</u>: Based on recommendations from the Academic Senate and projected faculty retirements this year, Superintendent/President Chui Tsang has approved 12 full-time, tenure-track faculty hires for fall 2007 in the following disciplines: accounting, anatomy/physiology, basic skills-reading, basic skills-writing (two positions), cosmetology, counseling, communication, dance, library, developmental math, and nursing. In addition, he is approving a one-year counseling position, funded by Title V federal money, once the college receives confirmation that the funding is in place.

<u>Strategic Planning</u>: The District Planning and Advisory Council (DPAC) has undertaken a strategic planning process that will be done in three phases: identifying three to five primary issues to be addressed; identifying strategies for each of the issues; and developing specific action plans for each of the areas. DPAC plans to accomplish one phase each semester, beginning in the spring semester.

<u>Winter 2007 Enrollment</u>: As of opening day, winter session 2007 enrollment is up approximately three percent from the same session last year. The increase marked a major turnaround for the college, which was experiencing a significant enrollment lag in early December. The college launched an aggressive marketing push in December that included email blasts, phone calls and postcards to current and prospective students, newspaper print ads; and an internal campaign to encourage faculty and other employees to get students to sign up for classes.

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# V. PRESENTATIONS AND BOARD DISCUSSION

<u>SMC Transportation Initiative</u>: SMC and Big Blue Bus officials outlined a plan that will both enhance existing bus lines and provide new bus connections to SMC's Main Campus and satellite campuses from throughout the Westside and within Santa Monica. The plan could begin as early as Spring 2007 with an extension of Line 13 through Palms and Mar Vista (areas that have high concentrations of SMC students) and on to the Bundy campus and the Main Campus. Line 13 currently comes from downtown Los Angeles and ends at the Westside Pavilion. At the same time, the plan proposes enhancing Line 11 (a north-south Santa Monica route that stops at the college) by increasing the frequency from every half hour to every 15 minutes with the intent to improve connection to the Metro buses that travel east-west on Wilshire and Santa Monica Boulevards.

Beginning in Fall 2007, the plan proposes to add a new route that directly connects UCLA and areas of West Los Angeles to the SMC Main Campus (Line 1).

Also in Fall 2007, the plan proposes a new circulator route through the eastside of Santa Monica that will connect the main campus to the Bundy campus and the Academy of Entertainment and Technology. This route will also serve Santa Monica residential and business communities, with stops along the route.

Lastly, the plan proposes the introduction of Rapid 7 service on Pico Boulevard, with a new eastward extension to the Metro Subway in Spring 2008.

The proposed plan is a component of SMC's overall transportation strategy, with the intent to reduce parking demand and neighborhood traffic congestion, to improve traffic flow on major boulevards, to reduce air and noise pollution, and to increase the convenience of attending SMC.

#### 2-A SMALL BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT CENTER

Title of Contract:	Small Business Development Center (SBDC)
Contracting Agency:	Long Beach City College – SBDC Network
Amount of Award:	\$250,000 (second year funding)
Performance Period:	(\$200,000 from SBA and \$50,000 from the Chancellor's Office) January I, 2007 – December 31, 2007

Summary: This will be the second year of funding for the SMC SBDC. Funds will be received from the Small Business Administration (SBA) and the CA Chancellor's Office to support the delivery of entrepreneurial workshops and business start-up services. The goal of the center is to upgrade the potential of success for new and small-size businesses primarily in the Westside. The Westside region includes the cities of Santa Monica, Beverly Hills, Malibu, Culver City and West Los Angeles sections such as Venice, Mar Vista, Century City, Brentwood, and Pacific Palisades. Services will also be provided to other parts of Los Angeles including the Topanga, Sherman Oaks and Hollywood areas.

The center will offer workshops on topics such as, but not limited to, business plan writing, accessing capital, sales and marketing. All will be provided under a short-term format in order to accommodate the special needs of current and future business owners. Other topics include customer service, financial planning, accounting/bookkeeping, employer/employee relationships, and Internet-based applications. The entire contract will last 12 months and is renewable upon successful completion of the contract's performance measurements. During 2006, SMC's SBDC received over 1,530 inquiries with 1,490 people participating in the center's workshops. These results exceeded the year's contractual goals by 378% and 75%, respectively.

Of the center's participant base, 294 were from the Westside region with business ventures ranging from manufacturing and technical service to retail and food distribution.

The project will be administered by SMC's Workforce and Economic Development Office. The SBDC will receive in-kind support from the City of Santa Monica in the form of facilities and standard overhead charges. A total of 1100 square feet will be dedicated along with utility charges provided at a cost of \$1 dollar per year. The SBDC will continue to be located at 3400 Airport Avenue near the Santa Monica Airport. Additional funding from the California Chancellor's Office, amounting to \$50,000, is also being committed to SMC in order to assure the success of the SBDC project.

Comment:	The College has not typically marketed the Winter Session to new students, relying exclusively on communicating the offering to continuing and returning students. However, by the end of November 2006, tracking results for the Winter 2007 Session indicated a significant lag in enrollment. Additional efforts coordinated through Enrollment Development – including targeted emails, targeted phone messages, staff follow-up, two direct mail communications, increased KCRW promotions, and newspaper advertisements – reversed the trend and produced a positive outcome. This Board action authorizes an internal adjustment of previously budgeted funds.

- <u>RECOMMENDATION</u>: The Board of Trustees adopt the rate of \$155 per unit per semester for nonresident tuition for 2007-2008. This is the same nonresident tuition rate as 2006-07 and is below the statewide average rate of \$173 per unit.

It is further recommended that the Board of Trustees adopt a \$30 per semester unit capital outlay recovery surcharge to be charged to nonresident students who are both citizens and residents of a foreign country. This represents a \$5 per semester unit increase for the capital outlay surcharge from the 2006-2007 approved surcharge but is significantly below the \$59 per semester unit rate that the District is approved to charge under the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office calculation.

BACKGROUND: Education Section 76140 authorizes districts to charge a nonresident tuition fee in the event it chooses to admit nonresident students. It also authorizes districts to charge a capital outlay recovery surcharge to nonresident students who are both citizens and residents of a foreign country so that districts may recover a prorata share of its capital outlay expenditures.

With the reduction in the state enrollment fee from 26 to 20 per semester unit, the total nonresident tuition rate is actually 1 below the tuition rate in effect at the beginning of 2006-07.

WHEREAS SMC has received demands from a private company for the public disclosure of faculty aggregate grades;

WHEREAS, because many community college students want to transfer to a second academic institution after studying at a community college, students with access to such information may seek to enroll in courses because they are taught by those who are perceived to be lenient graders, thereby making it difficult for community colleges to spread the student population among courses in a manner that maximizes the best use of college's faculty and facilities;

WHEREAS, other California colleges and universities appear to be struggling with the same problem., and Santa Monica College shares the concerns of other California public academic institutions about the wisdom of making public student grades by any particular faculty member, in the aggregate;

WHEREAS, to the extent that excessive leniency in grading by some faculty members in order to avoid cancellation of classes tends to deprive students of a creative and intellectually stimulating experience at Santa Monica College;

WHEREAS, all faculty hires should be made on the basis of merit and quality and all faculty should be competent to teach the courses they are hired to teach once they are hired, and subject to established peer review, the principles of academic freedom should be deemed central to successful teaching; NOW THEREFORE, the Santa Monica Community College District Board of Trustees resolves to urge the Chancellor of the California Community Colleges, the California Community College Trustees (CCCT) Board of Directors, and all other interested governing boards of California community colleges and state universities to propose, support, and lobby for legislation by the California State Legislature and the Governor of the State of California to amend the Public Documents Act to exempt aggregate and other forms of student grading issued by individual faculty members of California public college and universities from the public disclosure requirements of the Public Records Act.

#### BP 5525 Open Courses

The policy of the Santa Monica Community College District is that, unless specifically exempted by statute or regulation, every course, course section, or class, reported for state aid, wherever offered and maintained by the District shall be fully open to enrollment and participation by any person who has been admitted to the college and who meets such prerequisites as may be established pursuant to regulations contained in Title 5.

The statement of policy adopted by the Board shall be published in the official catalog and schedule of classes for which full-time equivalent students (FTEs) is reported for state apportionment.

Reference: Title 5, Section 51006

- <u>SUMMARY:</u> The practice of the District regarding open courses consistent with Title 5 regulations is printed in the schedule of classes. To comply with requirements of the Title 5, Section 51006 (b), it needs to be adopted as an official policy.
