Amendment to the

Collaborative for 2005-2006 and 2006-2007.

Terms of MOU: director <u>for an amount not to exceed \$55,000.</u>

Funding Source: 2005-2006 and 2006-2007 Budget/Child Care Center

Summary: The recommendation approved by the Board on October 9, 2006

stated that SMCCD is responsible for providing one (I) instructor, and reimbursement of the cost of one (I) site supervisor, for an amount not to exceed \$100,000, for the period July I, 2006 through June 30, 2007. However, the cost of the site supervisor is not covered in the \$100,000 payable to Easter Seals; therefore, additional approval is required in

order for LACOE to process the payment.

The Santa Monica Preschool Collaborative is a joint effort of Easter Seals of Southern California, Santa Monica Community College District, and Santa Monica-Malibu Unified School District. The mission of the Collaborative is to provide child care and development services to approximately 85 Santa Monica area children ages two through five

years.

Services Provided: This is a continuation of the contract with CCBCDC to provide job

placement assistance to participants trained through SMC's Job Development Incentive Fund grant. Activities and performance outcomes will be in accordance with California regulation(s) and SMC Workforce Development Department guidelines. This contract is designed to assist SMC in meeting its

contractual obligations to the California Chancellor's Office.

# 4. APPOINTMENT OF NEW MEMBER

At its meeting on August 14, 2006, the Board of Trustees appointed Lorraine Sanchez to the Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee for a two-year term, 2006-08.

#### **5. REPORTS and DISCUSSION** (reports enclosed)

<u>Summary of the role of the Committee</u>: Members of the Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee (CBOC) represent the community and the taxpayers in overseeing the District's spending of bond funds (Measures U and S) to make sure that the funds are spent appropriately. Staff provides financial reports and construction project updates. The Board sets the budget, hires the architects, and approves the contracts for the bond construction projects. The Board of Trustees receives all minutes and the annual report from the CBOC.

<u>Update on Completed Construction:</u> Two buildings were opened in fall, 2006 - Theater Arts Complex and the Liberal Arts Replacement Building (north) now named Humanities and Social Sciences (HSS). The second phase of the Liberal Arts Replacement Building (south) will be open in summer 2007. The Performing Arts Center and Music remodel at Madison will open next fall.

<u>Property Acquisition</u>: The District made on offer on property in Malibu; however, it did not work out and the agreement has been rescinded. The District is still looking for property in Malibu, focusing on the Civic Center area. The District is also pursuing property in Santa Monica for shuttle parking in order to relocate the temporary shuttle parking arrangement at the beach.

<u>Bond Measure:</u> State Facilities Bond measure ID on the November ballot would provide 50 percent funding for the SMC Student Services building. The other 50 percent would be from Measure U funds. Included in the bond issue is a provision to simplify the process of approval for community college construction projects. The standards of construction would not be reduced if passed, but the period of time a project "sits" at the state level would be greatly reduced, which would help keep the costs of projects from increasing.

In response to a question raised about the need for a Theater Arts Building and a Performing Arts Center, it was clarified that the Theater Arts Building is used strictly for the instructional program and performances. The Performing Arts Center, which is comparable to a mid-size New York theater, will provide the college and the community a larger, professional venue for all kinds of performances.
