


On average, SMC transfers approximately 3,200 students to four-year

institutions annually. SMC transferred more students to the UC and CSUs than out-of-state and instate private colleges and universities. The sum of the CSU/UC, out-of-state, and private in-state transfer counts is larger than the total transfer count as the total includes an *unduplicated* count across all categories. For example, a student who enrolled in a course in both a UC and a private instate in the subsequent year were counted only once in the total transfer count.




Trend Across Years (1.4 Number of Total Transfer in Academic Year – UC and CSU Only)

Transfers to UC and CSU combined is a metric included in the California Community College Chancellor's Office's *Vision for Success*. The Institutional Effectiveness Committee initially set a local goal for this metric to 3,148 transferred students in 2019. This number represents the total students needed to transfer to a CSU/UC annually to close the racial equity gaps for Black, Latine/x, Native American, and Pacific Islander students. The committee is currently in discussions to revise the goal for this metric and set the next three-year target for improvement.



Proportion of Students Who Achieved Outcome, Disaggregated by Race/Ethnicity (1.4 Number of Total Transfer in Academic Year)



The disaggregated data reveal that, on average, the share of transferred students who are Latine/x has increased. Among those who transferred in 2019-2020, Latine/x students made up 36.3% of all transfer. The share of transferred students who are Asian, Black, or white have decreased over the last six years.

While the share of successful transfers who are Latine/x students has increased, the 2019-2020 data indicate that SMC is producing an equity gap for this group for this metric as they are underrepresented in the successful outcome group (36.3%) when compared to their representation in the degree/transfer aspirants (those with a degree or transfer educational goal) population (42.9%). The equity gap produced for Latine/x students is 6.6%. SMC is also producing an equity gap of 2.5% for the Black student population as they are underrepresented in the transfer group (6.9%) when compared to their representation in the degree/transfer aspirants population (9.1%).

Data Table (1.4a Number of Total Transfer in Academic Year)

The transfer data using the accreditation (ACCJC) methodology counts all students who were identified as having transferred by the three data sources. Each year, the Institutional Effectiveness Committee recommends both the "stretch" goal for improvement (5,000) and institution-set standards or floor threshold (2,618) for this metric. In the most recent year with completed data (2020-2021), SMC transferred

2,892 students, meeting the institution-set standard of 2,618. SMC is 2,382 below the stretch goal of 5,000 annual transferred students.
