Members of the public may address the Board of Trustees by oral presentation concerning any subject that lies within the jurisdiction of the Board of Trustees provided the requirements and procedures herein set forth are observed:

1. Individuals wishing to speak to the Board at a Board of Trustees meeting during Public Comments or regarding item(s) on the agenda must complete an information card with name, address, name of organization (if applicable) and the topic or item on which comment is to be made.

Five minutes is allotted to each speaker per topic. If there are more than four speakers on any topic or item, the Board reserves the option of limiting the time for each speaker. A speaker's time may not be transferred to another speaker.

General Public Comments and Consent Agenda

- The card to speak during Public Comments or on a Consent Agenda item must be submitted to the recording secretary at the meeting **before** the Board reaches the Public Comments section in the agenda.
- Five minutes is allotted to each speaker per topic for general public comments or per item in the Consent Agenda. The speaker must adhere to the topic. Individuals wishing to speak during Public Comments or on a specific item on the Consent Agenda will be called upon during Public Comments.

Major Items of Business

- The card to speak during Major Items of Business must be submitted to the recording secretary at the meeting **before** the Board reaches that specific item in the Major Items of Business in the agenda.
- Five minutes is allotted to each speaker per item in Major Items of Business. The speaker must adhere to the topic. Individuals wishing to speak on a specific item in Major Items of Business will be called upon at the time that the Board reaches that item in the agenda.
- 2. No uncivil or disorderly conduct shall be permitted at any Board of Trustees meeting. Persistence in displaying such conduct shall be grounds for summary termination and/or removal of the person from the meeting by the Chair.
- 3. No oral presentation shall include formal charges or complaints against any employee of the District, regardless of whether or not the employee is identified in the presentation by name or by another reference which tends to identify the individual. Charges or complaints against employees shall be submitted to the Board of Trustees for consideration in closed session. Any employee against whom charges or complaints are to be made must be given 24 hours advanced notice and may request any such charges or complaints are heard in closed session.
- 4. Exceptions: This policy does not apply to individuals who address the Board at the invitation or request of the Board or the Superintendent.



WHEREAS, the Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk of the County has certified to the effect that the official canvass of returns for the Election reflected that more than 55% of the votes cast on the District's bond measure submitted to the voters at the Election (the "Measure") were cast in favor of the Measure, and such result has been entered in the minutes of this Board of Trustees of the District (the "District Board"); and

WHEREAS, the District Board has previously appointed a Citizens' Oversight Committee with respect to the District's Election of 2002 (Measure U) General Obligation Bonds (the "Committee") in accordance with Section 15278 et seq. of the Education Code;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of Santa Monica Community College District, as follows:

Section 2. The foregoing recitals are true and correct.

Section 3. The District Board hereby further appoints this Committee to serve as the Citizens' Oversight Committee for the Election of 2004 (Measure S) General Obligation Bonds to serve in accordance with the provisions of Section 15278 et. seq. of the Education Code.

Section 4. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.

FIRST READING - BOARD POLICY GENERAL DISTRICT, SECTION 2250, DISTRICT PLANNING AND ADVISORY COUNCIL

Proposed Board Policy Section 2250, District Planning and Advisory Council, is presented to the Board of Trustees for a first reading (review). The policy will be presented for a second reading and approval on January 10, 2005.

ARTICLE 2200: PARTICIPATORY GOVERNANCE

BP 2250 District Planning and Advisory Council

The Board of Trustees establishes the District Planning and Advisory Council. The Board recognizes the Council as the body primarily responsible for making recommendations to the Superintendent/President on all maters that are not otherwise the primary responsibility of the Academic Senate (BP 2210), Classified Senate (BP 2220), Associated Students (BP 2230) or the Management Association (BP 2240) or within the scope of collective bargaining. Issues include, but are not limited to, District budget, facilities, human resources, instruction, student services and technology planning.

The District Planning and Advisory Council shall comprise representatives of the faculty (Academic Senate and Faculty Association), classified staff (Classified Senate and CSEA), students (Associated Students) and management (Administration/Management Association), who shall mutually agree upon the numbers, privileges, and obligations of Council members. The District Planning and Advisory Council shall establish its own procedures in conformity with the law.

Comment:

This constitutes the first step in responding to the recommendation of the Accreditation Team regarding institutional planning and governance. Consensus was reached on this proposed policy by the Governance Structure Work Group at its meeting on November 30, 2004. The Work Group will continue to work on the detailed procedural matters.

Summary The proposed grant, Bridges to the Science Baccalaureate: From SMC to

UCLA, is a program designed to increase the number of minority students who transfer from Santa Monica College to the University of California, Los Angeles in the biomedical sciences. A key component of the program is involving students in performing basic or clinical research in laboratories affiliated with the UCLA School of Medicine and the West Los Angeles

Veterans Association Hospital.

Participants will be recruited both from area high schools that serve minority populations and from the diverse student body of Santa Monica College, a minority-serving institution. During their first year of study, this cohort of students will receive advisement, mentoring, and tutoring to increase success in introductory science courses.

They will also attend monthly seminars devoted to discussion of principles and practice of research. At the end of the first year, they will participate in a summer program beginning with a three-week introduction to research methods and culminating in placement in a research setting. Students will choose between basic laboratory research in membrane biology, molecular biology or nephrology or clinical research evaluating the safety and efficacy of treatments for hypertension or renal disease.

They will continue with their research projects during the second year of academic preparation for transfer, fulfilling a Life Sciences Department requirement for an independent research project in the final course of the majors biology sequence. By the conclusion of the three-year grant period, two cohorts of students will complete the program and transfer to UCLA.
