

KEY QUESTIONS TO ASK AT A COLLEGE FAIR FOR

ART MAJORS

Here are some questions you can ask a college/university admission representative. By gathering this information, you will have a clearer picture of the art programs and how they may aligns with your goals. Good luck with your research!

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

- Do you have a program in my concentration?
 - Check if the school offers programs in ceramics, graphic design, photography, painting, music education, music performance, composition, etc.
 - Look for details about the curriculum, faculty, and facilities. Programs may include studio work, theory, and critiques.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- Do you have a portfolio/audition requirement for admission?
 - Confirm if a portfolio or audition is required and what the school looks for. Check deadlines and any specific guidelines for submissions.
- Are there any specific courses required before I apply?
 - Ask if there are prerequisites like math, English, art history, or music theory. Clarify the application deadlines.
- Does your institution have an articulation agreement with SMC?
- What else can you tell me that would make me a competitive applicant?
 - Ask for advice on enhancing your application, such as extracurricular involvement, relevant experiences, or specific skills that are valued.

ACCREDITATION

- Are you accredited?
 - Check if the institution is accredited and by which organization. Accreditation affects
 the value of your degree and eligibility for financial aid.

TRANSFER CREDITS

- Will I get credit for courses taken before I transfer?
 - o Inquire about the transfer credit evaluation process. Understand which courses are transferable and how they will apply to your degree.

POST-GRADUATE OPPORTUNITIES

- What do students do after graduation?
 - Research alumni outcomes, job placement rates, and the types of careers graduates pursue. Look for internships or networking opportunities during the program.

FINANCIAL AID AND SCHOLARSHIPS

- What financial aid and scholarship opportunities are available?
 - Inquire about need-based and merit-based scholarships, grants, and assistantships.
 Ask about the application process and deadlines.

CAMPUS VISITS

- How can I arrange to visit your campus?
 - Look for campus visit opportunities, tours, or open house events. Consider scheduling a meeting with faculty or current students.
