Two thirds of the incoming class received financial assistance.

International students are not eligible to receive federal or USC need-based financial aid. AB 540 students may be eligible to receive a Cal Grant.

- Completed Common Application forms and USC's Writing Supplement
- Official college transcripts from all colleges attended
- Official high school transcripts

Optional Application Materials

- Supplemental materials and/or auditions, depending upon major
- TOEFL results (from some applicants)
- SAT or ACT results, if fewer than 30
- transferable semester units have been completed
