UndocuAlly training is a professional learning opportunity for district employees to gather skills and knowledge about undocumented students, communities, and students from mixed-status families. The trainings invite district employees to take responsibility for learning about the unique obstacles undocumented communities face and taking action. In addition, UndocuAlly trainings also allow us to learn about the resilience and capital that undocumented students possess.
